



89 articles published in 2016.


Number of articles has been increasing every year.

> Diverse Types of Articles Published in 2016




In 2016, HBSN has published **89** manuscripts, among which there are **42** review articles and original articles. Other article types include how we do it, meet the professor, preface, etc.





> International Diversity of Corresponding Authors in 2016




Corresponding authors of 18 articles published in 2016 come from **20** countries, 20% of them from the USA.


In 2017, HBSN will be evaluated by SCI. Hopefully, we will be indexed by SCI and get an impact factor soon.

➤ Monthly Retrievals in PubMed in 2016




Retrieval of HBSN in PubMed is increasing significantly, with a total of **123,566** times in 2016.
